Financial Abuse

What is financial abuse?

Financial or material abuse can take the form of fraud, theft or using a vulnerable adults property without their permission. This could involve large sums of money or just small amounts from a pension or allowance each week. Recognising Mate Crime

Previous awareness surveys in Lambeth have highlighted that both residents and professionals are not alert to mate crime. Safeguarding Adults Reviews elsewhere in the country also point to low levels of awareness.

Mate crime occurs when a person is harmed or taken advantage of by someone they thought was their friend. In some cases of mate crime victims have been [badly harmed or killed](#). Indicators of mate crime can be similar to other forms of abuse - potential signs are outlined in our [simple explainer](#).

Understanding Lasting Power of Attorney

A Lasting Power of Attorney (LPA) is a legal tool where you can give someone the legal authority to make certain decisions for you, if you become unable to make them yourself.
