Care Act requirements

Having a strategic plan

- Schedule 2 of the Care Act 2014 requires each Safeguarding Adults Board to publish a strategic plan for each financial year a plan which sets out
- Its strategy for achieving its objective of helping and protect adults in its area in cases where
 - An adult has care and support needs; and
 - They are experiencing, or at risk of, abuse or neglect; and
 - They cannot protect themselves from the risk of abuse or neglect because of their care and support needs
- What each member is to do to implement that strategy.

Consulting and involving others

In preparing its strategic plan, the Safeguarding Adults Board must

- Consult the Local Healthwatch organisation for its area; and
- Involve the community in its area

How met these requirements for 2016 - 17

The Care Act 2015 came in to force in April 2015. At that time the Chair of Lambeth Safeguarding Adults Board was undertaking a review of the Board on behalf of the Chief Executive of Lambeth Council.

The Board decided it was better to produce its Strategic Plan once this review was complete, even though this left a gap at the start of the year and it reduced the time available for consultation and involvement in producing the plan. We do not anticipate this to be an issue in future years.

Our plan for 2016-17

The plan was first developed at the Board's Development Day on 15th March 2016. It addressed six main areas

- Raising public awareness
- Preventing abuse and neglect in health and social care providers
- Embedding "Making Safeguarding Personal"
- Delivering the Deprivation of Liberty Safeguards
- Policies and Procedures

The Board created a sub-group to develop the plan, carry out the consultation with Lambeth Healthwatch and report back to the meeting of the Board on 5th July 2016 where the plan was agreed.
